A Tradition of Linking Scholarship and Activism

In 2017, we marked the Society's 50th anniversary. The SSS began amidst movements to assert civil rights, wages for housework, and an end to war in Vietnam. Today, Black Lives Matter, Idle No More, and Eco-Socialism are again re-shaping socialist and emancipatory movements.

Our members work to demonstrate the centrality of socialism before scholars, activists, and the wider public, and to build a socialist society. We also continue to widen and deepen our understandings of what socialism means.

Core SSS Activities

Our <u>annual conference</u> and <u>our peer-reviewed open-access academic journal <u>Socialist</u> <u>Studies</u> provide important platforms for established scholars. The efforts of our members and our volunteer executive, our journal editor and editorial board, as well as other volunteers, the conference and journal have also become important platforms for new scholars to disseminate their work.</u>

This year, we are also launching three **new initiatives** that we think might interest you.

The Conference

The 2020 SSS conference and annual general meeting take place on June 1-3, at the University of Western Ontario in London, ON. As always, we welcome participation on the full range of socialist inquiry. We are particularly excited about **our conference theme**, "Socialist perspectives on racial capitalism, colonialism and anti-blackness".

This reflects Congress' own unprecedented theme: "Bridging divides: Challenging colonialism and anti-blackness". But our theme also reflects the Society's socialist commitments, re-casting them over time along compelling and timely new paths. This year's line-up of plenary speakers is exciting: watch our website for more news.

The AGM occurs in an open slot in the conference programme, and is open to all members. The executive values member participation and we hope to see both familiar faces and new ones at London. Again, watch the website for the agenda and supporting documents.

We also operate a **travel grant programme** to aid younger, unwaged, low-waged, and overseas scholars to travel to our annual conference. This is a key expression of our values, and keeps us open to marginalized and up-and-coming voices. We are currently limited in our means, but your support can make a difference.

The Journal

In an increasingly commercialized and inaccessible publishing universe, our journal is online, open access and charges no author fees. This is as a socialist journal must be, and the Society bears the costs of production itself.

We have recently moved to a flexible publication schedule, which will reduce the time between acceptance of an article and its publication. Consider the journal for your next publication, or contact the editor, Sandra Rein, with plans for a special issue. And remember that the journal depends for its format and its continued existence on the Society's means, and therefore on donor and membership support.

The Three New Initiatives

With Megan Aitkin and Ian Liujia Tian attending executive meetings as per the decision of the last AGM, we are moving towards **official student representation** on the executive with a constitutional amendment to be brought to the 2020 AGM.

Building a very helpful and wide-ranging conversation at the AGM on how to expand SSS membership and its presence in the national conversation, we are encouraging the **formation of local chapters**.

Alongside the London conference, we hope to offer a **special public learning event** that connects with the conference theme, building on the model of a "Freedom School".
